COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This class focuses on a branch of the criminal justice system dealing with the process of probation and parole. The process will expose the student to the legal aspects, working environment and theories of supervising individuals who have been sentenced to a period of probation or release from incarceration. Students will explore theories, techniques and research methods associated with judicial settings and correctional institutions.

EXPECTATION OF STUDENTS:

- 1: Complete the assigned readings for each class
- 2: Participate in class discussions
- 3: Take exams at the time that they are given. There will be four exams and no make-up exams without a valid excusal. If a student fails to appear and complete an examination, that student will receive a grade of F for the missed test.
- 4: Absences will be limited to no more than three (3) and per college policy may necessitate a student's dismissal from the class unless they can produce a legitimate, written excusal.
- 5: Students are to be on time for all class meetings and prepared to participate in class.
